

Entry Level 3 – Unit 4 Researching and selecting a job opportunity

Assessment guidance for centre assessors

Assessment must take place before submitting candidate work to the OCR Examiner-moderator. This should be made evident by the centre assessor using annotations (i.e. ticks and comments). Centre assessors must refer to the Teaching Content contained within the Unit specification.

| Task no | Assessment criteria | Guidance |
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| 1 | 1.1 Identify different sectors | Candidates must identify two different sector areas eg retail, finance, catering. Centre assessors should refer to the OCR Employability Skills resources on sectors. |
| | 1.2 Identify jobs offered by local companies in different sectors | Candidates must identify two different jobs offered by local companies/organisations in each of the two sector areas. The companies must be named. An address is not needed. Candidates may link this activity with AC1.1. |
| | 1.3 Identify products and/or services linked to different jobs | Candidates must identify one product or service that these jobs are involved in making or providing. Candidates may complete a table or carry out a matching exercise. Candidates may link this activity with AC1.1 and AC1.2. |
| | 1.4 Identify the work environment for different jobs | Candidates must identify the work environment where people carrying out two of the jobs mainly work (eg shop floor, greenhouse). Candidates may complete a table or carry out a matching exercise. Candidates may link this activity with AC1.1, AC1.2 and AC1.3. |
| 2a | 2.1 Identify job opportunities in different types of employment, to include employment in a company self-employment voluntary work or work experience | Candidates must give one example of a local job for each type of employment listed in AC2.1. There should be a total of three different local jobs. In the case of voluntary/work experience and employed, the organisation organisation/company name and the job title must be provided. For self- employed, candidates must identify a local self-employment opportunity e.g., window cleaner, maker of handmade furniture. |

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| 2b | 2.2 Identify working patterns for different jobs | Candidates must identify four different working patterns. They might be given the job and suggest the working pattern or be given the working pattern and identify a likely job that follows this pattern. |

| | 2.3 Outline advantages and disadvantages of different working patterns | Candidates must outline one advantage and one disadvantage of four different working patterns. |
| 2c | 2.4 Identify reasons for selecting a working pattern rejecting a working pattern | Candidates must identify one working pattern that they would like and give one reason for selecting it. They must select one working pattern that they would not like and give one reason for their choice. A short phrase or sentence is required for each reason. |
| 3a | 3.1 Identify jobs in a preferred working pattern | Candidates must identify two jobs which fit their preferred working pattern. Ideally, candidates should use the preferred working pattern identified in AC2.4. |
| | 3.2 State facts about different jobs in a preferred working pattern, to include main duties services or products offered location of organisation rate of pay | For each of the two jobs chosen in AC3.1, candidates must find out two facts about each job. The facts identified must be those listed in AC3.2. Specific detail is required, eg location of organisation is Solihull, West Midlands |
| | 3.3 Identify sources of information which provide facts about jobs in a preferred working pattern | Candidates must name two different sources of information where they found out the facts about the two jobs selected in AC3.1 and AC3.2. This should be at least two different sources of information overall. Sources of information must be named ie <u>www.yell.com</u> , The Daily Echo. |
| 3b | 3.4 State reasons for choosing a job | Candidates must select one job from those identified in AC3.1 and give three reasons why they have selected it (eg opportunities for promotion, good pay, can walk to work). A short phrase is required for each reason. |
