	This qualification is competence-based. This means that it is linked to a person's ability to competently perform a range of tasks connected with their work and are assessed in the workplace.

Entry requirements	No previous experience or qualifications in this subject are required, although you can progress to this qualification from:

	You will need to be working in a school either as a volunteer or employee.
Age restrictions	You must be a minimum of 16 years old
Is this qualification right for me?	The OCR Level 2 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools is right for you if work or volunteer in a school carrying out a support role within the classroom i.e. a Teaching Assistant. You may be new to this role and the qualification will help you to understand your role and responsibilities within the school environment. You may already be in employment and want to increase your skills and knowledge without the additional requirements of the Apprenticeship Framework and therefore may choose to complete the qualification outside of the Apprenticeship framework.
	The OCR Level 3 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools (QCF) is part of a suite of qualifications in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools (STLS) at Levels 2 & 3 and consists of units based on the national occupational standards developed by the Training and Development Agency (TDA), who were the recognised sector body responsible for the training and development of the school workforce.
How could I progress from this qualification?	The primary purpose of this qualification is to confirm that you are competent in a specific job role. This qualification will enable you to undertake a learning programme to confirm that you are competent in a role where you have responsibility in supporting the teacher in the classroom and wider school activities. It targets the key skills, knowledge and competence that employers would expect of someone working at this level as a support worker (Teaching Assistant) in a school.
