One Year Outline for Post-16 Students

This curriculum plan reflects one approach to preparing students to retake the work themselves. We have assumed that the students will study this course over 30 school weeks for two hours a week and have divided those **30 weeks into five units of six weeks each**. As the students are preparing to retake their GCSE English Language in limited time it is more skills focussed than the other suggested curriculum plans. As the spoken language mark for J351/03/04 can be carried forward, this has not been included in the outline.
