





Volume of prism = (area of cross-section) \times length






The Quadratic Equation



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

12 Ashraf has 8 cards with these numbers on them.




(a) Ashraf chooses a card at random. The probability that he chooses a card with a number greater than the integer x is $\frac{5}{8}$.

Write down the value of x.




