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Subject-specific Marking Instructions

Where answers are required and given in French, these should not be marked for the quality of language. The French should be credited even if spelt incorrectly provided the word(s) given appear correct or sound correct when read by a native French speaker. Answers required in French and given in English are not credited unless they constitute “cognates” – i.e. words which are virtually identical in English and in French, e.g. “November” for “novembre”. Examples of acceptable spellings in French appear on the main scheme below

Reject "window" TC. Reject "screen", "front screen", "bus screen", "screen at front of bus" etc. Omission of either element loses mark. Accept addition of prepositions which do not distort meaning. (e.g. "Square in front of town hall") Reject additional day of the week e.g. "Saturday and Sunday". Omission of either element loses mark. Accept "international <u>driving permit</u> " but reject "international permit" (TC) "Permit" does NOT invalidate an otherwise correct answer.

	34. well-maintained / good condition / good quality / well-kept / in better condition than roads on the East coast	1	Accept synonym conveying correct concept (the good condition or the good maintenance of the roads). Reject "good", "well built", "well made", "well paved". Reject "tarmacked" but HA.

	36. drive at night / drive in the dark	1	Reject "at night" (TC), "drive <u>all</u> night". Tolerate inclusion of "late", "very late", "too late" etc. e.g. "Drive late at night".

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
