Write a letter to tell your cousin in Gujarat about a new friend.

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses

You can use your own ideas or you could include these ideas:

- describe your new friend (e.g. male / female / age / height)
- say where you normally meet him / her (e.g. at a party / sports event / youth club)
- describe an occasion you were with your friend or you plan to be with him / her and how you feel about it
- say what you like / dislike about this friend and why
- say whether you think it is important to maintain your friendship and why.

Question 2 Health and sport

Write a blog-post about different activities on your camping holiday in Gujarat.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- describe your typical camping holiday (e.g. where / how long / with who)
- describe what active pastimes you do on this holiday (e.g. ball games / walking / climbing)
- talk about a new game you have played or intend to play with your friends in U.K. and how you feel about it
- say what advantages / disadvantages you see in these active pastimes and why
- say whether it is important for U.K. students to learn to play different sports from Gujarat and other countries and why.

Question 3 Leisure and entertainment

Write an article about a film on television or in cinema.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses

You can use your own ideas or you could include these ideas:

- talk about your viewing habits (e.g. where / who with / when)
- say what types of films you like to watch (e.g. musical / detective / science fiction)
- describe a film you have seen recently or plan to see and how you feel about it
- say whether you like or dislike Indian films and why
- say whether you prefer Bollywood or other countries' films and why.

Question 4 Travel and the wider world

Write a report about your visit to a national park in the UK or abroad.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses

You can use your own ideas **or** you could include these ideas:

- describe a national park you know (e.g. where / size / animals)
- say what you do in that national park (e.g. visit places / take photographs / have picnics)
- describe a visit you made to a national park or plan to make and say how you feel about it
- say whether you like to visit national parks or not and why
- say whether or not it is important to preserve the national parks in the world and why.

Question 5 Education and work

Write an email about your work experience.

Remember:

- to give factual information **and** explain ideas and points of view (your own or those of others)
- to use a variety of vocabulary, different types of sentences and different verb tenses

You can use your own ideas or you could include these ideas:

- write about your school life (e.g. subjects / teachers / homework)
- describe a typical day at work experience (e.g. travel / the work / the people)
- describe some particular work experience you have done or plan to do and say how you feel about it
- say what the advantages and disadvantages of work experience are and why
- say whether or not you think work experience abroad in another country is a good thing and why.
