If you are from the West Midlands and have an offer at the University of Cambridge, you could apply for an OCR bursary worth £3,000 per year.

## What is the OCR Bursary?

The OCR Bursary helps talented West Midlands students, who may need additional financial support, to make the most of their opportunity to study at the University of Cambridge. It results from OCR's historical association with the West Midlands Examinations Board and supports our commitment to recognise and encourage the achievement of all learners.

For the academic year 2020–21, we will award a bursary of **£3,000 for each year of undergraduate study** for up to 10 new first-year students studying at the University. This bursary will be paid directly to the College and can be used for living costs, tuition fees or a combination of both.

The bursary will be subject to certain conditions of renewal each year; for example, students must meet a minimum academic standard (usually second-class honours level) and their College must confirm their continued enrolment.

## Who can apply?

Students who:

- have completed or are completing their secondary education in a school, sixth-form college or FE college within the geographical boundaries of any of the Birmingham, Coventry, Dudley, Herefordshire, Sandwell, Shropshire, Solihull, Staffordshire, Walsall, Warwickshire, Wolverhampton or Worcestershire Local Education Authorities
- are eligible for Home (UK) fee status
- have been offered a place on a full-time undergraduate degree course at the University of Cambridge (including those intending to take a gap year)
- have not been awarded funding or sponsorship for university study by any other organisation or scheme (this does not include funding received from Student Finance England or a University of Cambridge bursary)
- have, or expect to be awarded, an OCR qualification (such as GCSE, AS/A Level, Cambridge Technical) that contributes to the academic profile on which a Cambridge place offer is based

## How to apply

Students can submit applications themselves or schools can submit on their behalf.

Schools and colleges should nominate eligible students who they believe would benefit from the award. Centres can nominate more than one student.

Both the student and the nominating centre must complete their relevant sections of the form.

Students should make sure their self-profile includes:

- any particular needs that the bursary might help with
- information about any notable achievements within and/or outside school
- any special circumstances to bring to the attention of the selectors

Make sure that you include a full copy of the student UCAS form (including all references).

## Selection

We make provisional selections in June 2020 and confirm final offers to students in August 2020, when the University of Cambridge has confirmed a student's place.

We use POLAR and Index of Multiple Deprivation data, along with free school meals and 16-19 bursary eligibility information when we select our bursary recipients.

## Data Retention

Bursary application forms are retained until after the awarding panel decision is confirmed. Administrative data of successful applicants is retained for 7 years from the date of the award.
