 Social inequality is the unequal distribution of
 income, education and health across a population.
 One way level of income influences social inequality
 is when people don't have much disposable income
 to spend on wants and desires, so their standard
 of living decreases. Having less disposable income
 every month means that saving money is essential.
 When buying **SEEN** food, cheaper goods are sometimes
 less healthy and more fatty such as chips, burgers,
 fast food etc. Eating fatty foods causes health
 problems, such as diabetes. **SEEN**
 Another way how level of income influences
 social inequality is it restricts **SEEN** education for some
 people. An example of this is university fees. **SEEN**
 University fees are very expensive and cost
 around £15,000 - £25,000 on average. Not being
 able to go to ^{university} college restricts you from working
 at a high skill level, resulting in lower income
 in the future. **SEEN** This influences social inequality hugely. **L2**

1	(d)	A place's identity at a local scale is shaped by many characteristics, natural characteristics, demographic, socio-economic, built environment, culture and political. SEEN
		An example of two places places that show these characteristics is Coldhurst and Saddleworth, both found in Oldham, Greater Manchester, England. SEEN
		The natural characteristics (physical geography) of Saddleworth includes trees, shrubbery, ^{soil types,} and vegetation and plants. The soil type of Saddleworth is very poor and infertile due to the history of the land where grazing of the grass has removed a lot of the nutrients in the soil. Also the landscape of Saddleworth also shapes the place's identity. The MOSE is one of the most memorable things about the village of Saddleworth.
	EVAL	As well as natural the physical geography shaping the area of a place so does the demographic of an area. For example in Coldhurst SEEN there is a population of 13,000 people, this is split into within these 13,000 people there is 60% of people which have a Bangladeshi heritage and ^{30%} 30% of white heritage. This tells me that Coldhurst is a very diverse area. Also there are 30% of people that are aged between SEEN -15 and 10% of people aged between 65+. This tells me that the area of Coldhurst is a ^{residential} area area with as there are many

children and little amounts of elderly people. On the other hand in Saddleworth there is a population of 10,000. 97% of people are white, 0.2% are Bangladeshi, 15% of people are aged 0-15 and 25% are aged 65+. These statistics tells me that this place has a ageing ~~sp~~ population. This is because the scenery is desirable, there is less people and Saddleworth is a place where people like to retire as it is more desirable.

Another thing that helps shape the identity of a place is socio-economic factors. In Coldhurst household income is on average £20,000 per year. This is 50% smaller than Saddleworth's £40,000 per year. This statistic shapes the area of Saddleworth as more affluent ~~seen~~ another statistic which shows this is the education ~~seen~~ grades. Children with 5 GCSE results graded A-C is 50% in Coldhurst and 75% in Saddleworth. This helps identify the place as more affluent and desirable as the grades are better in Saddleworth than in Coldhurst.

Also the built ~~seen~~ environment shows differences as in Coldhurst the majority of houses are red brick terraced houses but in Saddleworth the majority of housing is stone detached housing.

To conclude although natural characteristics help shape the identity of a place, there are other factors which help identify a place too. I think that

		the demographic and socio-economic factors influence how a place is shaped more than natural characteristics as there is more evidence, facts and stats to prove this.
3	(a)(i)	<p>one advantage of the data presentation is that it is clear SEEN to see which country receives the highest number of immigrants REVE within the EU. I can see that Germany receives the most by about 150,000.</p> <p>I can</p> <p>Another advantage of the data presentation is that it allows you to compare the immigrant numbers of intra-regional immigrants from 2014 to the numbers in the 2000s. It tells you each country's number of immigrants exactly SEEN in 2014 with numbers next to each bar. For example I can see that Germany has 415.9 thousand immigrants and Croatia has 2.3 thousand immigrants. It is easy to see the difference between REVE each country and who receives the most/less number of intra-regional immigrants in 2014.</p>

Germany, UK, Spain, France etc. may have higher wages ^{SEEN} therefore more people will want to migrate so that they can earn ^{more} money. This money could be sent back to the country of origin through remittance ^{SEEN} or spent in the country they have migrated to.

3 (b) In the USA there are 14 million migrants each year that enter the United States of America. This makes up 12% of their population. 11 million of these migrants are Mexican. The intra-regional migration of these Mexicans cause some social problems.

One social challenge faced is the language barrier ^{SEEN} of immigrants that migrate to the USA.

Some of the migrants do not speak English whereas the vast majority of America do. This causes problems in day ^{SEEN} to day communication. Children cannot be taught [^] as they do not understand English. Mexicans cannot [^] communicate with others because they do not know the language. This [^] causes conflict/violence towards the migrants as some ^{SEEN} Americans get frustrated with the migrants. Gang violence, crime and fighting [^] outbreaks because of the language barrier.

Another social challenge the US faces is the strain of water ^{SEEN} supplies. Because there is an extra 14 million migrants entering the US each year, there is less water for people to use. This causes droughts and different strategies which are put in place to reduce the strain on water.

4 It is the strategies of the UN which offer the most effective protection of human rights in areas of conflict.

The United Nation has 193 member states, its aims are to tackle poverty and protect human rights in them ~~193~~ countries. One area facing conflict is Syria. The civil war that has been happening in Syria since 2011 was caused by initially teenage boys in Daraa, graffitiing on walls vandalising properties, they were detained which caused uproar and forced the government to take forced action.

In Syria there has been over 470,000 deaths causing 400,000 refugees to flee the country to countries such as Turkey and Lebanon. The UN has ~~brought~~ sent ~~aid~~ humanitarian ^{SEEN} aid to Syria in order to protect civilians caught in the crossfire of the civil war. Peacekeepers ^{SEEN} also have been sent to protect the human rights of the people in need in Syria.

The UN has provided ^{SEEN} aid such as economic funding, shelter for the 200,000 homes that have been destroyed, food, drink and clothing for people in need in Syria.
