# Command Verb Definitions for Cambridge Technicals (Internally Assessed units)

The purpose of this <u>guide</u> is to give a definition of the command verbs used in the internally assessed (moderated units) for all Cambridge Technicals qualifications. ### Cambridge Technicals Health and Social Care level 3 Mapping Guide

This <u>document</u> was first published for centres delivering the Cambridge Technical (2016) Level 3 when it was new. However, this document is still very relevant for any centres moving across from 2012 or BTEC as it maps the content of each of the 2016 Level 3 units to Cambridge Technical (2012) Level 3 and BTEC Nationals units.

#### Internal standardisation generic guide

This <u>document</u> sets out how centres may approach internal standardisation. A component of the administration process sometimes overlooked by centres, this document explains the purpose of internal standardisation, staff roles and sampling. It also includes a meeting template and a sample plan and feedback record. A very supportive and useful document to include in your administration processes.

#### **ExamBuilder**

ExamBuilder is a user-friendly package in which you can design your own bespoke exams and tests using a library of exam questions from OCR past papers. You can select topics for assessment and part or full exam questions to test your students' understanding of the subject against genuine exam questions. Putting together a test takes minutes and they can be printed with your school or college's logo on an exam style front sheet. A guide on how to build a topic test using Exambuilder has been published, along with four practice tests for Unit 4. Please note Interchange access is required to download the practice tests.

ExamBuilder is free for all OCR centres with an Interchange account and gives you unlimited users per centre.
