GCSE, AS and A Level Physical Education



Updates to support you and your students

We have made some improvements to GCSE, AS and A Level PE to help support the delivery of these qualifications.

We listen to feedback from teachers and are committed to making improvements to our qualifications and services. GCSE, AS and A Level teachers have told us that they like the OCR approach to Non Exam Assessment, but would like to see changes to the way they receive mark breakdowns. In addition, A level teachers would like a clearer and more streamlined approach to the Evaluation and Analysis of Performance for Improvement (EAPI).

In response to this feedback and our internal reviews, we have made some changes.

This change was originally introduced for first assessment in June 2021, and was communicated in December 2020 on our website.

The changes below are applicable from September 2021 for students taking their final assessments in 2022.

The focus of these changes is not to add to your workload, but to improve your experience of delivering our AS and A Level PE qualifications. We hope that the changes to the AS/A level EAPI tasks will also improve your students' experience of this aspect of the assessment and help you in addressing the impact on teaching and learning because of the disruption experienced due to the pandemic in 2020 and 2021.
