

Unit Title:	Designing an art or craft product

Unit purpose and aim

This unit aims to provide learners with the opportunity to demonstrate they can design and plan an art or craft product.

The Learner will: 1 Be able to develop ideas for an art or craft product using different sources	The Learner can: 1.1 Use sources of information to find ideas for an art or craft product 1.2 Use feedback to develop ideas	<p>The learner shows they can use more than one source of information to find ideas for an art or craft product. Example sources could include: using magazines, newspapers, the internet, cutting out pictures.</p> <p>The learner shows that they can use feedback to develop ideas. Examples could include: using recommended materials, changing the size or shape of the product, adding extra detail to the product.</p>
2 Be able to produce the final design	2.1 Develop ideas into a design of an art or craft product 2.2 Identify the resources needed to make the product	<p>The learner shows that they can develop their ideas into a design of an art/craft product. Examples could include: drawing sketches, making notes, collecting materials and making a design board.</p> <p>The learner shows they can identify the resources needed to make the product. Examples could include: providing a written or verbal list of the materials and equipment needed, pointing out the materials needed.</p>

Learning Outcomes	Assessment Criteria	Example of ways assessment criteria could be met
	2.3 Present the final design	The learner shows that they can present a final design. Examples could include: a picture of the final design, verbal description of the product and its features.

Assessment
