Read the following scenario.

Scenario

Natural Shift is a new performing arts festival that aims to raise awareness of environmental issues. Community arts is at the heart of the festival, with a series of performances taking place over the summer months.

The performances will take place at different local community venues as well as at professional performance venues. The festival will also have some performances that will tour the area to make sure awareness of the environment is spread far and wide.

All the performances are free of charge and open to all members of the community, including family audiences.

The festival has been funded through a public sector grant.

The performance companies involved include established professional companies as well as community groups and amateur performance groups.

The festival is being run by a committee made up of local council employees and an Artistic Director has been contracted.

You have been contracted for a fixed period of time that covers the planning, running and evaluation phases of the festival. You will be directly responsible to the Artistic Director.

The following questions relate to the roles and responsibilities you will undertake as the Arts Administrator for the Natural Shift Festival.

Questions 1 and 2

The committee, made up of local council employees, is responsible for meeting legal obligations relating to the festival. You have been asked to consider the legal requirements that will need to be in place.
